HAY's 13Eighty chair designed by Dutch designers
Scholten & Baijings is aptly named after the number
of tiny holes in the moulded polypropylene shell.
These perforations create a characteristic aesthetic,
where transparency and a play of light and shadows
add to the chair's expression, while the variations in
the sizes of the holes bring a sense of movement to the
visual appearance. They also have a functional use in
draining rainwater off when the chairs

are used outdoors.

In the event of lime deposits on the surface, use a clean, damp cloth wrung in lukewarm water with one part vinegar to nine parts water and avoid scrubbing as this may scratch the surface.

Iskos-Berlin's Soft Edge chair and stool series was originally created by exploring innovative developments in moulded plywood techniques.

The Copenhagen-based design duo collaborated with HAY to push the boundaries of industrial moulding, combining strong curves with extreme lightness to create a three-dimensionality that is not normally possible with 2D plywood. All the edges of the ultra-thin, soft-formed seats are bent away from the body, designed to optimise human-centric comfort for constant shifting and movement.

The series has since been extended to include chairs and stools with frames in wood or steel with different finishes, while the seat is available in 2D plywood, upholstery or plastic in different colours.

To remove stains, use a clean, lint-free cloth to apply the lather from a solution of water and a mild detergent, or soap flakes or use a special leather care product. As marble is a natural material, each stone has unique colours, patterns and textures. Therefore, the surface's colour and finish may vary slightly from product to product. Wipe with a clean cloth wrung in water. The marble is not resistant to acids. There is a risk that if any acidic liquids come into contact with the tabletop surface it will appear stained. Wiping the stains off immediately may help, but please note there is no guarantee that acidic stains or spots can be completely removed. Avoid using scouring cream or scouring pads, as they may scratch the surface. Never use vinegar, ammonia, acetic acid or citric acid or abrasive cleaners.

United by a common principle of symmetrical geometry, the Palissade collection is engineered to reproduce the same visual simplicity and core strength throughout. Designed in colour and form to integrate effortlessly into a natural landscape or urban setting, Palissade is intended to be used over a longer period of time and become more beautiful over the years.

The chairs and benches are also available with a hot-dip galvanised finish, offering maintenance-free longevity. The collection is suited to a wide variety of environments, from cafés and restaurants to gardens, terraces and balconies.

With a little care you can prolong the life of your furniture. Follow the instructions for the materials of your specific product to make sure that it stays in the best shape for as long as possible.

The information below is only intended as a general guideline. For more information on how to remove specific stains, please enquire where you bought the furniture.

- On hot galvanised steel, please make sure to wipe all surfaces before use, as the zinc surface oxidises during transportation and can become humid. This can stain your clothing if it comes into contact with it.
- / The products in the Palissade
  Collection have a two component
  coating; a primer and an outdoor
  powder coating which provides a
  barrier to corrosive elements making
  it suitable for outdoor use. It complies
  with the highest quality standards and
  is designed to last, making it ideal for
  both private and public environments.
- / All products in the Palissade collection are handcrafted and minor blemishes and imperfections may be visible. These are not considered defects and do not interfere with the quality and function of the product.

- / Always remove stains quickly before they can do any permanent damage to the furniture.
- / Make sure to wipe off any sun cream or other liquids from the furniture after use, as these can leave stains on the surface if left in direct sunlight.
- / Wipe off the furniture if it becomes wet after rain or snowfall as this will damage the surface over time.
- / Wipe off bird droppings quickly as they may lead to permanent corrosion or staining.

### STORAGE

The life expectancy of your furniture will vary depending on the weather and type of use. We recommend that you store it in a dry, ventilated place during winter and keep it protected from scratches and bumps.

# POWDER COATED STEEL

Wipe with a clean cloth wrung in water or in a solution of water and a neutral detergent. Remove soap residue immediately using a clean, dry cloth. Avoid using scouring cream or scouring pads, as they may scratch the surface. In the event of lime deposits on the surface use a clean, damp cloth wrung in lukewarm water with one part vinegar to nine parts water and avoid scrubbing as this may scratch the surface.

Small scratches or damage to the powder coated surfaces can lead to corrosion. They can be retouched and protected from corrosion with a special repair lacquer available at HAY stores and authorized dealers. If the metal is uncovered it is nec-

essary to sand the area before repairing it (grain 220). Wipe it over with a clean dry cloth and clean the area with methylated spirits before repainting it. Do not use solvents as they may have an adverse effect on the coating. Never use acetic acid or citric acid.

# HOT GALVANISED STEEL

Hot-dip galvanised steel is essentially maintenance free, although cleaning is recommended at regular intervals.

Wipe with a clean cloth wrung in water or in a solution of water and a neutral detergent. Remove soap residue immediately using a clean, dry cloth. Avoid using scouring cream or scouring pads, as they may scratch the surface.

**HAY** 

The combination of Neu's ergonomically moulded shell with cast swivel base or solid wooden legs results in a perfectly defined profile. The durable, finely-grained plastic adds textural interest, while the rim detail gives the design structure and character.

- / Avoid improper use such as sitting on the back or armrests, tilting the seats on their back legs, putting your feet on the furniture or standing on it.

- / Be careful not to scratch or damage the surface with sharp objects.
- / Smooth out creases and wrinkles with your hand after use to even out the fabric.
- Avoid covering the surface partially, for example with cushions or skins, as colour variances may appear.
- / Check the status of the gliders frequently and if worn down, contact your local retailer to buy replacements. The durability of the gliders will depend on the surface that the chair is placed on.

## WATER-BASED LACQUERED WOOD

Wipe with a clean cloth wrung in water or in a solution of water and a neutral detergent. Remove soap residue immediately using a clean, dry cloth. If the surface is scratched or appears matt, use a care product specifically suited to lacquered or stained wood. Avoid using detergents containing silicone, as they seal the stain in and make subsequent repairs more difficult. Avoid using scouring cream or scouring pads, as they may scratch the surface.

# OILED WOOD

Wipe with a clean, dry cloth, If the surface is dirty, wipe with a clean cloth wrung in water or in a solution of water and a neutral detergent or soap flakes. Remove any soap residue immediately using a clean, dry cloth. Never use soft soap or solvents such as spirit, turpentine or acetone. Avoid using scouring cream or scouring pads, as they may scratch the surface. If the surface is scratched or appears matt, make sure to use an oil hardening care product specifically designed to maintain oiled wooden surfaces. Clean the furniture thoroughly (12 hours) before applying the oil to all surfaces. To ensure optimal absorbency, gently sand down the wood using fine-grit sandpaper (No. 180 or 240), always sanding in the direction of the grain. Apply the oil generously using a clean cloth or a sponge, always applying in the direction of the grain. Do not pour the oil directly on the surface. When the surface is glistening, leave the oil on for around

two hours until fully absorbed. Remove any excess oil with a clean lint-free cloth. Leave the furniture to dry overnight (min. 12 hours) and avoid placing anything on the surface before it is completely dry.

If the grain of the wood rises after oiling, gently sand down the wood using fine-grit sandpaper (No. 180 or 240), always sanding in the direction of the grain. To optimally maintain the naturally beautiful appearance of the wood, we recommend you regularly treat the furniture's surface with oil whenever it appears dull, scratched or as needed.

# PLASTIC ( POLYPROPYLENE )

Wipe with a clean cloth wrung in water or in a solution of water and a neutral detergent. Remove soap residue immediately using a clean, dry cloth. Avoid using scouring cream or scouring pads, as they may scratch the surface. Do not use cleaning products containing alcohol, as they may damage the surface.

# POWDER COATED OR POLISHED ALUMINIUM

Wipe with a clean cloth wrung in water or in a solution of water and a neutral detergent. Remove soap residue immediately using a clean, dry cloth. Avoid using scouring cream or scouring pads, as they may scratch the surface.

Vacuum the furniture regularly using the upholstery nozzle to remove dust and avoid fluff and pilling. Straighten the fabric with your hands from time to time. Wrinkles in the fabric can be straightened using a steamer. Soak up spilled liquids immediately with an absorbent napkin or cloth by dabbing gently towards the centre of the stain. Never use concentrated detergents or bleach, ammonia, optical brighteners or soap intended for hard surfaces. We do not recommend spot cleaning of individual marks and stains as this damages the fabric and causes colour loss.

On wool fabrics, most stains can be removed with lukewarm water on a clean lint-free cloth. If necessary, add a little neutral detergent. Avoid rubbing the material hard as this could result in loss of colour and damage the fabric. It may also be necessary to use a hairdryer to avoid leaving an water outline. If the stain persist, consult a specialist cleaner.

## **VELOUR**

Vacuum the furniture regularly using the upholstery nozzle /or brushing with a soft clothes brush – always in the direction of the nap to remove dust and avoid fluff and pilling.

To rejuvenate velour and restore its pile, rub it with a well wrung, slightly damp cloth in the direction of the nap. When you sit on velour fabric, you exert a pressure that forces the nap in different directions. Together with heat, rising air humidity, body moisture and the type of upholstery, this can cause these changes of direction to become fixed, creating a slight change in colour. This is a typical property of velour, and is neither a defect nor a sign of low quality. This effect can be removed by applying a damp (not wet) cloth and leaving it overnight, which will restore the pile to its original direction. The upholstered furniture should not be used until it is completely dry. If necessary, a hair dryer can be used at a low temperature setting.

The same result can be achieved by steaming or spraying distilled water at a distance of 20 cm from the fabric for a few seconds, before leaving overnight. Care should be taken not to spill large quantities of water on the fabric. It is advisable to treat the whole surface in order to avoid shading. This treatment can be repeated if necessary. After this treatment, the upholstered furniture must be completely dry before it can be used again. A hair dryer at a low temperature setting can be used. To restore the pile to its original direction, please brush with a soft brush.

# ANILINE LEATHER

Aniline leather has no or only a light surface treatment to preserve the leather's natural surface and soft touch. All natural markings, such as scars and insect bites, will be visible on aniline leather, which contributes to the leather's exclusive appearance. This kind of leather is very susceptible to dirt, and over time it will patinate and become slightly darker. Be careful not to scratch the leather. Aniline leather is demanding to maintain, and we recommend that you keep a cleaner and care product suitable for this type of leather at hand. Using water may leave a permanent stain on the surface. Do not use sharp objects, strong detergents or solvents on the leather.

## SEMI-ANILINE LEATHER

Semi-aniline leather is a full grain leather with a light top finish. All natural markings. such as scars and insect bites, will be visible on the leather. Vacuum regularly using the upholstery nozzle. Be careful not to scratch the leather. To remove stains, use a clean, lint-free cloth to apply the lather from a solution of water and a neutral detergent or soap flakes or use a special leather care product. Remove soap residue immediately using a clean, dry cloth, and polish gently, using a soft cotton cloth. Avoid pressing liquid into the pores of the leather. Apply a protective lotion two to four times annually to enhance the resistance of the material. Do not use sharp objects, strong detergents or solvents on the leather

## PIGMENTED LEATHER

Pigmented leather is corrected leather with excellent durability. Vacuum regularly using the upholstery nozzle. Be careful not to scratch the leather. To remove stains use a clean, lint-free cloth to apply the leather from a solution of water and a mild detergent, or soap flakes or use a special leather care product. Remove soap residue immediately using a clean, dry cloth, and polish gently, using a soft cotton cloth. Avoid pressing liquid into the pores of the leather. Apply a protective lotion two to four times annually to enhance the resistance of the material. Do not use sharp objects, strong detergents or solvents on the leather.

### OILED WOOD

To ensure optimal absorbency, gently sand down the wood using fine-grit sandpaper (No. 180 or 240), always sanding in the direction of the grain. Apply the oil generously using a clean cloth or a sponge, always sanding in the direction of the grain.

Do not pour the oil directly on the surface. When the surface is glistening, leave the oil on for around two hours until fully absorbed. Remove any excess oil with a clean lint-free cloth. Leave the furniture to dry overnight (min. 12 hours) and avoid placing anything on the surface before it is completely dry. If the grain of the wood rises after oiling, gently sand down the wood using fine-grit sandpaper (No. 180 or 240), always sanding in the direction of the grain. To optimally maintain the naturally beautiful appearance of the wood, we recommend you regularly treat the furniture's surface with oil whenever it appears dull, scratched or as needed.

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# HEE



The philosophy behind the Hee Series was to take an archetypal chair and perfect it down to the last detail while cutting the essentials to the bone.

The goal was to create a contemporary chair to fit into a wide range of contexts. The attempt was a great success, resulting in the pragmatic and easily decoded Hee series. Like a line drawing, it wraps metres of metal wire into neat, straight lines in three versions: bar stool, lounge chair and dining chair.

Stackable and weatherproof, the wide assortment of colours and designs make Hee suitable for numerous indoor and outdoor contexts, such as bars and restaurants, as well as public spaces and home environments.

With a little care you can prolong the life of your furniture. Follow the instructions for the materials of your specific product to make sure that it stays in the best shape for as long as possible.

The information below is only intended as a general guideline. For more information on how to remove specific stains, please enquire where you bought the furniture.

- / The products in the Hee Series have a two component coating; a primer and an outdoor powder coating which provides a barrier to corrosive elements making it suitable for outdoor use. It complies with the highest quality standards and is designed to last, making it ideal for both private and public environments.
- / Always remove stains quickly before they can do any permanent damage to the furniture.
- / When you move your furniture, make sure you lift it rather than pulling or pushing it to avoid damaging the floor, legs and mountings.
- / On tables, tighten up the screws after one to two months' use.
- / Avoid improper use such as sitting on the back or armrests, tilting the seats on their back legs, putting your feet on the furniture or standing on it.

- / On tables, use coasters under damp, hot or coloured objects to avoid permanent stains.
- / Be careful not to scratch or damage the surface with sharp objects.
- / Avoid partially covering the surface, for example with tablecloths, cushions or place mats, as colour variances may appear.
- / Minor spots of rust under the furniture and bases are considered as a natural result of general use and can be treated using the care instructions below.
- / Direct placement on a seafront can lead to corrosion.
- / Wipe off bird droppings quickly as they may lead to permanent corrosion or staining.
- / Wipe off the furniture if it becomes wet after rain or snowfall as this will damage the surface over time.
- / Check the status of the gliders frequently and if worn down, contact your local retailer to buy replacements. The durability of the gliders will depend on the surface the chair is placed on.
- / Take care not to scratch the chairs against each other when stacking them. Do not move or drag the chairs around when stacked as the weight will damage the legs.

## POWDER COATED STEEL

Wipe with a clean cloth wrung in water or in asolution of water and a neutral detergent. Remove soap residue immediately using a clean, dry cloth. Avoid using scouring cream or scouring pads, as they may scratch the surface. In the event of lime deposits on the surface use a clean, damp cloth wrung in lukewarm water with one part vinegar to nine parts water and avoid scrubbing as this may scratch the surface.

Small scratches or damage to the powder coated surfaces can lead to corrosion. They can be retouched and protected from corrosion with a special repair lacquer available at HAY stores and authorized dealers. If the metal is uncovered it is necessary to sand the area before repairing it (grain 220). Wipe it over with a clean dry cloth and clean the area with methylated spirits before repainting it. Do not use solvents as they may have an adverse eff ect on the coating. Never use acetic acid or citric acid.

### **GLIDERS**

Check the status of the gliders frequently and if worn down, contact your local retailer to buy replacements. The durability of the gliders will depend on the surface the chair is placed on.

# **STORAGE**

The life expectancy of your furniture will vary depending on the weather and type of use. We recommend that you store it in a dry, ventilated place during winter and keep it protected from scratches and bumps.

On wool fabrics, most stains can be removed with lukewarm water on a clean lint-free cloth. If necessary, add a little neutral detergent. Avoid rubbing the material hard as this could result in loss of colour and damage the fabric. It may also be necessary to use a hairdryer to avoid leaving an water outline. If the stain persist, consult a specialist cleaner.

#### **VELOUR**

Vacuum the furniture regularly using the upholstery nozzle /or brushing with a soft clothes brush - always in the direction of the nap to remove dust and avoid fluff and pilling. To rejuvenate velour and restore its pile, rub it with a well wrung, slightly damp cloth in the direction of the nap. When you sit on velour fabric, you exert a pressure that forces the nap in different directions. Together with heat, rising air humidity, body moisture and the type of upholstery, this can cause these changes of direction to become fixed, creating a slight change in colour. This is a typical property of velour, and is neither a defect nor a sign of low quality. This effect can be removed by applying a damp (not wet) cloth and leaving it overnight, which will restore the pile to its original direction. The upholstered furniture should not be used until it is completely dry. If necessary, a hair dryer can be used at a low temperature

setting. The same result can be achieved by steaming or spraying distilled water at a distance of 20 cm from the fabric for a few seconds, before leaving overnight. Care should be taken not to spill large quantities of water on the fabric. It is advisable to treat the whole surface in order to avoid shading. This treatment can be repeated if necessary. After this treatment, the upholstered furniture must be completely dry before it can be used again. A hair dryer at a low temperatue setting can be used. To restore the pile to its original direction, please brush with a soft brush.

#### ANII INF I FATHER

Aniline leather has no or only a light surface treatment to preserve the leather's natural surface and soft touch. All natural markings, such as scars and insect bites, will be visible on aniline leather, which contributes to the leather's exclusive appearance. This kind of leather is very susceptible to dirt, and over time it will patinate and become slightly darker. Be careful not to scratch the leather.

Aniline leather is demanding to maintain, and we recommend that you keep a cleaner and care product suitable for this type of leather at hand. Using water may leave a permanent stain on the surface. Do not use sharp objects, strong detergents or solvents on the leather.

#### SEMI-ANILINE LEATHER

Semi-aniline leather is a full grain leather with a light top finish. All natural markings, such as scars and insect bites, will be visible on the leather. Vacuum regularly using the upholstery nozzle. Be careful not to scratch the leather. To remove stains, use a clean, lint-free cloth to apply the lather from a solution of water and a neutral detergent or soap flakes or use a special leather care product. Remove soap residue immediately using a clean, dry cloth, and polish gently, using a soft cotton cloth. Avoid pressing liquid into the pores of the leather. Apply a protective lotion two to four times annually to enhance the resistance of the material. Do not use sharp objects, strong detergents or solvents on the leather.

#### PIGMENTED I FATHER

Pigmented leather is corrected leather with excellent durability. Vacuum regularly using the upholstery nozzle. Be careful not to scratch the leather. To remove stains, use a clean, lint-free cloth to apply the lather from a solution of water and a mild detergent, or soap flakes or use a special leather care product. Remove soap residue immediately using a clean, dry cloth, and polish gently, using a soft cotton cloth. Avoid pressing liquid into the pores of the leather. Apply a protective lotion two to four times annually to enhance the resistance of the material. Do not use sharp objects, strong detergents or solvents on the leather.

To optimally care for the leather, clean it using a vacuum cleaner once or twice a month with a soft brush to remove any dust. Thoroughly clean it once or twice a year by using foam from soap flakes stirred in warm water. Apply the foam with a dry soft cloth, making sure to minimize any contact with water. Avoid bar soap, saddle soap, leather cleaners, household detergents or chemical products. Protect from direct sunlight, excessive heat and sharp objects.
